NEW PARTNERSHIP WITH EXODUS WORLD SERVICE

On January 30th, we will be hosting a Cross Cultural Training for any and all adults and friends at PRCC in Jordan Hall. We will begin at 11:30 with a soup lunch and finish at 2:30.

This training prepares each volunteer to engage with a refugee individual or family in Chicagoland. It offers in-depth learning and activities to broaden a volunteer's understanding of who refugees are and how they get to the United States, as well as what help they receive when they arrive. Learn about the culture(s) of many refugees who are arriving and how to navigate cross-cultural communication and friendship. After this training, individuals can begin volunteering with the Exodus Neighboring Program to include things such as:

- Socialize with families and individuals
- Help students with tutoring
- Help with language learning
- Help with learning history and actions towards citizenship

The Youth will be participating in a Refugee Simulation with Exodus as well, it has been rescheduled for March 13th!
