

A Whole Life?

The New Year is a good time to reflect on the choices and patterns that occupy our days. It's a time when many of us will adopt new resolutions for the year ahead: new diets, new habits, drop old habits...trying to find balance, happiness, peace...abundance. In spite of our best efforts, finding balance and peace is often elusive.

Yet, Jesus said that His desire for us is that we would have life – ABUNDANT life! In January and February, we will explore some of the scripture lessons that reveal a piece of the puzzle to abundant living. We will consider different aspects that make for a whole life. Relational wholeness, physical wholeness, emotional wholeness, spiritual wholeness all factor into living a whole life. Thomas Merton claims that there is in all things, a hidden wholeness. Through our study, prayer, and reflection, we will try and discover sustainable ways of adapting our lives to find balance and abundance as we achieve wholeness.

Right about now, I have to pause and pay attention to the cynical voice in my head that says "Carol, you sound like a self-help book not a spiritual leader."

Here's the thing. There are LOTS of self-help books and methods for being your best self. But they fall short when they don't seek to connect us with the Living God, creator of the heavens and the earth. Our God desires for us to be whole, and as we connect with God and with one another, as we care for the things that matter most and put the things that don't matter into perspective...we begin to discover abundance. Sometimes religion has been used to diminish people rather than build them up, celebrating self-deprecation and guilting people rather than helping individuals experience wholeness. Wholly Living, caring for our bodies, minds, and souls is spiritual work, and I believe living a whole life, not only allows us to experience abundance, but prepares us to share God's love and light in ways that we simply can't when we're barely holding on. A significant piece of our wholeness is our mental health. Whether mental illness like depression or bi-polar disorder are a part of your life or simply finding space to process grief and past hurts, addressing our mental health is huge. The staff and I are committed to helping connect folks who might need a recommendation to specialists to address mental health. Our Stephen Ministers are bringing in some experts to help us all as well. Pretending that all is well when it's not tears us apart, which is in direct opposition to wholeness and abundance. I look forward to learning together with you as we all seek to live a whole life.

Some of you know that I have a bit of a competitive edge. I motivate myself to do things I don't want to by rewarding myself and I like a good challenge. During this series, there will be an opportunity to track several different habits that lead to wholeness – praying, exercising, talking with a friend (not texting), doing something for fun, etc. Each time you do a habit, you get a point and can submit your progress. At the end of our series in March, we will reward the three most Wholly People a gift that will contribute to their wholeness! In the process, whether you win the reward or not, we will have fun and hopefully discover ways to experience abundant living right now!

You're invited to join Pastor Carol on Wednesday evenings from 7:30-9:00 pm in the Library for a study on wholeness, which will include the enneagram, spiritual practices, relationship enrichment, and more!

January 30, February 6 and February 13 at 7:30 pm join our Stephen Ministry team as we learn from NAMI and others through a mental health series!

STEPHEN MINISTRY MESSAGE

In the beginning when God created the heavens and the earth, the earth was a formless void and darkness covered the face of the deep, while a wind from God swept over the face of the waters - Genesis 1:1-2

My favorite Christmas Eve reading is John 1: 1-14. I love the poetry of it, especially verses 4 and 5: "What has come into being in him was life, and the life was the light of all people. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it." The first verse is wonderful too: "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God." Those verses got me to thinking about the New Year coming around again, another chance for a new beginning, and then about the beginning of creation itself.

We don't really know much about those first few moments of creation. The Big Bang theory posits that a huge explosion called a "singularity" resulted in the formation of everything we can see, and lots of dark matter that we can't. This remains the best explanation scientists have come up with, but the answers to what exactly a singularity is, how it happened, and (the most interesting to me) why it happened has so far eluded human understanding.

Those compelling questions propel much of science, including our space program. For example, NASA's most recent Mars probe isn't roving all over the planet. It is going to stay in one place and dig down into the Martian soil to find out exactly



how and when the planet was formed. Although designed to measure marsquakes, (of course there couldn't be earthquakes on Mars!) NASA was excited to discover that the lander has been transmitting the sound of the wind back to earth. Here is the NASA YouTube video link in case you'd like to hear it for yourself. Just think of it! We lucky few can do what even Albert Einstein couldn't. We can do what Sir Francis Bacon and Copernicus probably wouldn't have even believed possible: we can listen to the wind blowing on Mars. (In fairness, there have been sounds recorded from the surface of Venus by the Russians, and from Saturn's biggest moon, Titan, by the EU. But neither of those recordings is of the wind.)

However, as interesting as this is, it doesn't answer the question of why something is there and not nothing. This question has inspired poets, philosophers, and scientists since homo sapiens began to listen in wonder to the whispers in the blowing wind. The Hebrew Bible begins with a poetic answer to the question of why and how there is anything at all. A poetic answer – but one that is surprisingly consistent with the scientific version of events.

Genesis 1:1-2 says that God speaks – he breathes the Word like a mighty wind into the formless void, and in that moment sets into motion all of creation. He says, "Let there be light." And light begins shining in the darkness, never to be overcome by it.

That is the promise we are given and the hope we cherish as people of faith. Down through the eons of the continuing evolution of creation, the voice of the Spirit is carried in the wind rustling the maple leaves in the parkway, shaking the evergreens on far away mountains, stirring the waves across the stormy oceans, burnishing ice caves in the Antarctic, and raising dust on the barren rusty surface of Mars.

Like all people of faith, Stephen Ministers know that the voice of the Spirit can be heard not only in the wind, but also in a whispered prayer, in the sigh of a grieving loved one, and in words of frustration and pain spoken from the heart. Stephen Ministers know that whatever challenges we may face, no matter how difficult the days we might experience, the darkness will not extinguish the light.
